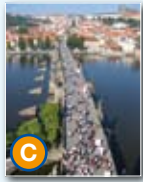
To experience the city fully join our complimentary four-hour tour or take advantage of our discounted six-hour Superior Tour (normally CZK 1500; with this map CZK 770 CZK per person).



A) Prague Castle – the largest medieval castle in the world, jewel of the Czech capital. Some of the most interesting monuments include the enchanting St Vitus Cathedral, St George's Basilica and Convent, Prague Castle Gallery and Golden Lane (a series of small shops that once served as housing for the palace guards). Entrance fees are required for a few selected areas, but visitors can walk freely through the grounds and even into the larger portion of the cathedral. Allow at least half a day for a visit.



B) Old Town Square and Astronomical Clock – just in the heart of the Old Town surrounded by charming Baroque, Gothic and Rococo architecture, Old Town Square is a great place to hang around, have lunch at one of its many cafes, hire a horse or vintage car sightseeing ride, browse market stalls or just watch the Astronomical Clock performance on each hour. Don't miss the Church of Our Lady Before Týn, the rococo Kinsky Palace, and the baroque St Nicholas Church.



C) Charles Bridge – dating back to 1357, this bridge was built to replace Judith's Bridge from the 12th century. There are thirty sculptures that decorate the bridge, dating mainly from the Baroque period. Charles Bridge is one of the most popular tourist spots - vibrant day or night, scattered with vendors and entertainers. Early morning is the best time to experience a less crowded walk, although a romantic evening walk through the impressively lit streets of Prague by night is nice too.



D) Jewish Quarter (Josefov) – the oldest Jewish settlement in Europe, named after Emperor Josef II. Here are two figures synonymous with this part of the city, Franz Kafka and the mystical humunculus Golem created by Rabi Löw. The Jewish cemetery, Old-new Synagogue, Klausen Synagogue and the Pinkas Synagogue are definitely worthwhile sights. Admission to the Jewish Museum is 300 CZK and for the Old-new Synagogue is 200 CZK.



E) Municipal House – Prague's most prominent Art Nouveau building, with an interior partially designed by Alphonse Mucha, built between 1905 and 1912. Smetana Hall, situated in the heart of the building, is used as a concert hall and ballroom. Next to the Municipal House is the Powder Gate – one of the 13 original fortified gates to Old Town. There is also a small exhibition about the tower and it is open for great views of the city.



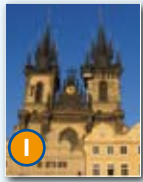
F) Petřín Hill and Funicular – escape to the green peaceful grounds of Petřín and climb up the Observation Tower to enjoy great views of the city. Funicular Railway to Petřín Hill is opposite tram stop Ujezd (trams 12, 22) in Lesser Town. The railway runs at 10-15 minutes intervals. From Petřín Hill you can take a walk to the Strahov Monastery. The monastery area includes the unique Strahov Library, decorated with Baroque ceiling frescos.



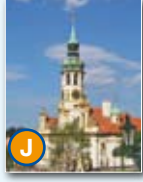
G) Vyšehrad – once it was a forbidding fortress and now it is a popular place for locals during weekends. Due to its position on a higher rock just above the Vltava river it offers nice panoramic views over part of Prague. Visit the city's oldest Romanesque rotunda of St Martin, the Church of St Peter & Paul, and enjoy a peaceful walk in the gardens. It is easily and quickly reachable from the centre by metro line C to station Vyšehrad. From there it is about a 10-minute walk to Vyšehrad's main gate.



H) Wenceslas Square – a hustle and bustle of commerce. It really comes alive after dark, when its restaurants, cinemas and nightclubs attract the tourist crowds. At the northern end of the square you can find the neo-Renaissance National Museum and St Wenceslas Monument. Another significant building is Koruna palace – a covered shopping arcade with a stunning glass dome dating from 1911. Square was first laid out over 600 years when it was used as a horse market.



I) Church of Our Lady Before Týn – an Old Town Square landmark with distinctive twin spires that are a reassuring sight to many tourists after losing their bearings in the narrow surrounding byways. The interior's Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque features include sculptures of Calvary, a pewter font and a 15th century Gothic pulpit. An interesting thing is that the Danish astronomer Tycho Brahe is buried here in a marble tomb.



J) Loreta – a pilgrimage site established by Katherina von Lobkovic in 1626 where you can see a replica of Santa Casa. The Santa Casa is an over-decorated Baroque cube which has fragmentary frescoes inside, and houses the wonder-working statue of Our Lady of Loreto. The Loreta treasury has a famed collection of vestments and other religious objects. In the south-western corner is the Chapel of Our Lady of Sorrows, which has a sculpture of a crucified bearded woman.

HOW TO JOIN US FOR A GUIDED TOUR

Walks/Tours Meeting Point

The meeting point for all the walks (except the Beer and Ghost Tour) is next to the very famous Astronomical Clock on the Old Town Square. You might ask at your hotel reception for exact directions. The clock is a five-minute walk from Staroměstská metro or tram station, and is one of the most famous locations in Prague. Your guide waits for you with a red Prague Airport Transfers sign umbrella, standing 30 metres away from the clock. Please turn up 10 minutes before the walk starts. For the Beer and Ghost Tour, the pickup point is from the Premiant Tour kiosk at Na Příkopě 23, which is five minutes' walk from Wenceslas Square.

Boat Departure Point

You can either use the complimentary hotel pickup or make your own way to the boat. The boat departure point is from Dvořákovo Quay, and the boat is located between Čechův Bridge and Štefánikův Bridge. If you walk from Old Town Square, follow Pařížská Street and after ten minutes you reach the river (Čechův Bridge), right next to the Intercontinental Hotel. Then you walk down to the pier and walk another five minutes (to the right in relation to Prague Castle) until you see the Classic River boat. Please be at the boat departure pier at least 10 minutes before boat departure time. The boat's name is Classic River. The Jazzboat cruise departure point is from a slightly different place; please refer to the mark on the map.

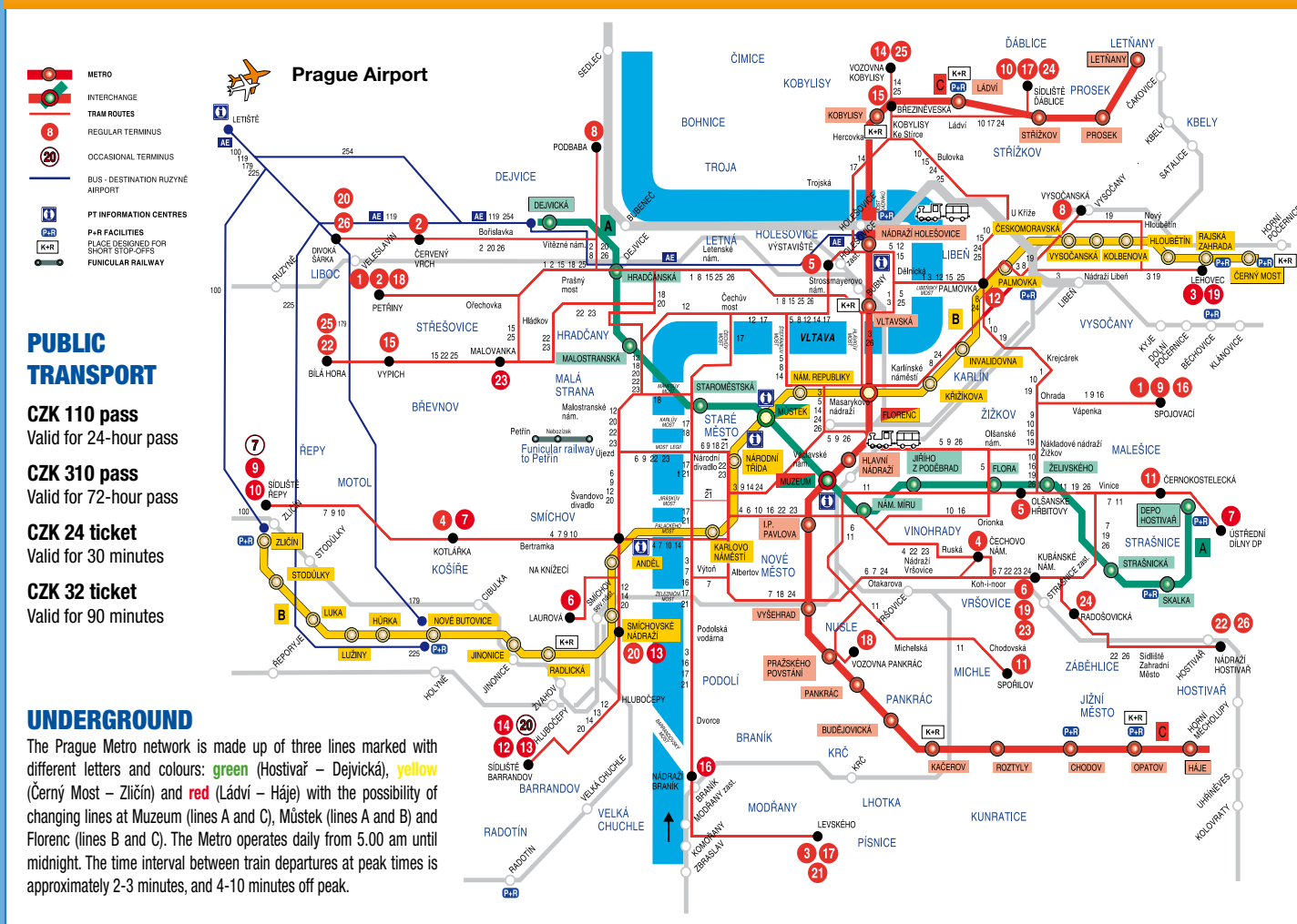
Day Trips/Excursions Pickup Point

PRAGUE AIRPORT TRANSFERS

Do I have to pre-book a tour, excursion or river cruise?
Yes - except for our free tour, please make a booking at least a few hours in advance. Book online or call us on our freephone number (+420) 800 870 888. If you cancel your tour up to two hours before the tour starts, we have no cancellation charges.

Should I tip the driver?
If you are happy with the service then it is customary to tip around 10%. However, this is entirely at your discretion, although please bear in mind that even a small tip will keep your driver extra happy.)

Do you wish to change, cancel, or book return transport?
Just give us a call between 7am and midnight, daily. You can also text or email us.

Private Transfer Departure
Upon your departure our driver will collect you at the address or hotel given in the reservation form. If you are accommodated in a hotel, the driver will pick you up at reception, or possibly the apartment address.

Shared Shuttle Transfer Departure
The driver will pick you up within 20 minutes before or after your requested time. Therefore, it is necessary to be ready for departure from your hotel at least 20 minutes in advance and to be prepared for the possibility that the driver may also arrive up to 20 minutes late.

When do I have to pay for the return transfer?
You can choose to pay the total amount at once when you arrive at your hotel, or to pay for each trip separately. Our chauffeur will denote whether payment includes just one-way or a return trip. All major currencies and cards are accepted. If you pay in cash in other than local currency (CZK) the price may vary slightly based on the actual exchange rate.
